Record of Student Development (RSD):

Read carefully. Be informed. Do not be misguided.

- O RSD does not affect a student to pass or fail
- O It is up to each student to add RSD approved activities on-line, participating in the RSD program is voluntary
- O It may take several days after a session is complete to have your activity approved depending on attendance submission
- O Your RSD is separate from your education degree, and has no weight on your final <u>education</u> transcript
- O Your RSD simply tracks professional learning opportunities you participate in outside of your regular scheduled courses
- O In effort to have Nipissing University students participate in extra learning opportunities, learning outcomes are tracked as an incentive for students to attend multiple sessions
- O Students must achieve 20 learning outcomes in order to receive an 'official RSD transcript'
- O Unofficial transcripts are still available if you do not complete the minimum requirement of 20 learning outcomes
- O You can earn 3-5 learning outcomes at any given session
- O You can earn the same learning outcome more than once, but it is only counted once toward the overall goal of achieving 20
- O You should not base your participation on any professional learning opportunity on whether it is RSD approved or not. We encourage students to participate in any opportunity that will increase their teaching tool kits
- Your resumé also offers a great platform to showcase your participation in professional learning opportunities
